Sybil Ward

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Dr. Rhonda Mattox is the incoming President of the Arkansas Medical, Dental, and Pharmaceutical Association (AMDPA), a professional organization of physicians, pharmacists and dentists of color throughout Arkansas. She is the first psychiatrist to serve as President of AMDPA since its inception 125 + years ago. Dr. Mattox is a board-certified physician and a diplomate of the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology. She served as an Associate Professor in Family Medicine and Psychiatry at University of Arkansas Medical Sciences (UAMS) and an instructor at the University of California-Los Angeles (UCLA). She is an integrative behavioral health psychiatrist and medical media research consultant. She serves as a mental health consultant to primary care providers and juvenile justice centers. Dr. Mattox's work has been at the intersection of clinical care, public health, and health policy. She has been at the forefront of reducing stigma and increasing access to behavioral health care across the nation in myriad ways. From Hollywood to Capitol Hill, she has been behind the scenes consulting in medicine, media, and research, as well as state and national health policy.

The Regional AIDS Interfaith Network (RAIN*AR) is where Sybil Ward joined the HIV trenches as a receptionist. Over the course of a decade, she advanced from Afro-Centric Program Director, Associate Director, and finally Executive Director. She traveled the United States taking RAIN's model of compassionate HIV/AIDS education to diverse communities and congregations from churches, synagogues, temples and mosques, providing prevent education to over 7,500 individuals. For the last 15 years with Jefferson Comprehensive Care System, Inc. (JCCSI), Mrs. Ward served in a multitude of roles on various grant projects with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Substance Abuse and Mental Health Service Agency (SAMHSA), and Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) with a mission to ensure all Arkansans had access to comprehensive health care services. Sybil Ward is the Co-Founder and Executive Director of Wards of Serenity, Inc. a non-profit organization with a mission to serve as a catalyst for the hurting, by providing tools for empowerment, substance abuse and HIV prevention education, testing, and referrals. Mrs. Ward's interweaving of recovery principles, prevention best practices, and faith virtues has inspired a rewarding and adventurous career. She is a licensed and ordained chaplain/minister trained at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. Mrs. Ward has partnered with the Arkansas Minority Health Commission, to bring information to the minority communities throughout the state of Arkansas. Nationally her efforts included collaborative workshop presentations on "Recruiting and Working with Minority Congregations" for the Ecumenical AIDS Ministry, Atlanta, Georgia; the Presbyterian Conference on AIDS in Newark, New Jersey; and the Baptist Southern Convention, to name a few. Today Mrs. Ward has the privilege to serve as HIV Program Manager for Arkansas Medical Dental & Pharmaceutical Association (AMDPA) Arkansas Zeroing In movement.

Dr. Yolanda Lawson is a Board Certified OBGYN and Associate attending at Baylor University Medical Center. She has a genuine passion for the physical, emotional and overall health of women. She earned her M.D. degree at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. She performed her internship at Morehouse School of Medicine in Atlanta, Georgia; and completed her residency at St. John Hospital & Medical Center in Detroit, Michigan. Dr. Lawson offers a broadened approach to healthcare due to her extensive exposure at several major medical centers. She is a member of the American Medical Association, the National Medical Association, the American Congress of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, and the Dallas County Medical Society, sits on a variety of boards and volunteers among many other community activities and organizations.

Dr. Shaletha Jones is a native of Camden, AR. She is a 2001 honors graduate of Camden Fairview High School. She attended college at Louisiana Tech University. She received her medical degree from Ross University School of Medicine. She completed her Family Medicine residency with the Department of Family Medicine at University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in Little Rock, Arkansas. She is currently a hospitalist at Ouachita County Medical Center. Her passion is preventive healthcare, community medicine, and patient advocacy. She has a non-profit organization called Changing Health Awareness Together. She has a social media presence as CHAT with Dr. Shaun, where provides general information on healthcare topics for the community.

Dr. Balamurugan (or Dr. Bala, as he prefers to be called) is a board-certified family physician, an epidemiologist, and the Deputy Chief Medical Officer at the Arkansas Department of Health (ADH). He joined the DFPM as an adjunct. Clinical Assistant Professor in 2013 and precepts residents and medical students in the FMC. He obtained his medical degree from India and completed his Family Medicine residency at our program, where he was a chief resident. He obtained his Master of Public Health with an emphasis in Epidemiology from the Tulane University School of Public Health and Tropical Medicine. He further obtained his Doctorate in Public Health with an emphasis in Health Policy and Epidemiology from UAMS. Besides serving as the ADH Deputy Chief Medical Officer, he is also the State Chronic Disease Director, overseeing and providing medical guidance to chronic disease programs such as heart disease, stroke, diabetes, cancer, nutrition and physical activity across the state through the ADH's local health units. Additionally, he serves as an adjunct Associate Professor at the Department of Epidemiology in the UAMS College of Public Health. He is widely published both in national and international journals and has obtained numerous awards for his work. These include the Director's Science Award for his contribution to the ADH, the Chronic Disease Champion by the National Association of Chronic Disease Directors, and the Physician Volunteer of the Year award for his work at the Harmony Health Clinic, which serves the uninsured and underinsured residents of central Arkansas. Dr. Bala also is a member of the editorial board of the Journal of the Arkansas Medical Society.

Dr. Susan Ward-Jones is an Internal Medicine Specialist in West Memphis, Arkansas. She has over 30 years of experience in the medical field. She graduated from University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, College of Medicine, UAMS, in 1993. She is affiliated with the Methodist University Hospital and is a provider for the East Arkansas Family Health Center in West Memphis, Arkansas.

Dr. Harold B. Betton, MD, PhD, MS, MA is a Principal Physician at the Betton Clinic in Little Rock, Arkansas. Dr. Betton graduated from the University of Washington School of Medicine in 1975 and has worked in the medical field for over 40 years. He specializes in Family Medicine and Pediatrics and is affiliated with Baptist Health Medical Center Little Rock and Baptist Health Medical Center North Little Rock. Dr. Betton has been teaching since 2006 and is an Adjunct Professor of Religion at Arkansas Baptist College in Little Rock, Arkansas, as well as Pastor of New Light Baptist Church. He is the recipient of the Silas Hunt Award, April 29, 2016, University of Arkansas given as the first Black Student to graduate from the University of Arkansas School of Agriculture and the first Black undergraduate to do research at the institution. He also received the Soaring Eagle Award from Howard University Hospital as Co-Director of the Spirituality and Medicine Program, April 2017.

Billy Burris is a licensed social work mental health professional and pastor, with years of experience in the field. He has also chaired the forensic division of the National Association of State Mental Health program and is a certified trainer of law enforcement officers. In addition, he currently serves as a board member for both the Arkansas sexual offender assessment committee and Inner-city Futurenet in Arkansas coalition against domestic violence groups. Pastor Burris also presently volunteers as a chaplain with North Little Rock Police Department

Pastor Cory Dobbins is a highly skilled and credentialed therapist. Dr. Bailey is a graduate of University of Texas Medical Branch at Galveston. He completed his psychiatry residency at UT Houston, and he completed a fellowship in forensic psychiatry at Yale. He has also completed a visiting fellowship in transcranial magnetic stimulation at Duke. After finishing his forensics fellowship in 1995, he joined the faculty at LSU as an Assistant Professor of Psychiatry. He also served on the faculty at UT Houston and Baylor before becoming Department Head for Psychiatry at Meharry Medical College in 2008. He was recruited to serve as the Department Head for Psychiatry at Wake Forest before moving to Los Angeles for his current positions as Assistant Dean and CMO. He has authored or co-authored over 50 peer reviewed publications and he has written books about healthcare reform and firearms violence.
