

Dr. Keith Rawlings is a highly respected medical professional known for his significant contributions in the field of HIV/AIDS treatment and prevention. He served as the Medical Director of the Peabody Health Center in Dallas, Texas, where he treated about 600 patients suffering from HIV. He received his medical degree from the University of Maryland, School of Medicine, and completed his residency in Internal Medicine at the Union Memorial Hospital in Baltimore.

In 2003, Dr. Rawlings was named Practitioner of the Year by the National Medical Association for his efforts in the fight against HIV and AIDS. He also heads Integrated Minority AIDS Network Inc., or IMANi, a non-profit organization that trains health care professionals involved in HIV care who focus particularly on the minority community.

Currently, Dr. Rawlings is the Senior Global Medical Director at ViiV Healthcare. Dr. Rawlings has published over 100 articles, abstracts, and manuscripts and co-edited one of the few books, HIV/AIDS in U.S. Communities of Color, which addressed the HIV epidemic among minorities in the US. He has been an active clinical educator, community leader, and advocate on HIV and minority health for decades.
