



Attorney Brenda Stallings is a graduate of the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff (UAPB) and William H. Bowen School of Law. She is licensed to practice law in Arkansas, Michigan and Tennessee.

Attorney Stallings has been practicing law for 27 years. Her entire career has been community-oriented service. Attorney Stallings was previously employed by The Center for Arkansas Legal Services handling domestic, probate, child support, probate and consumer law cases. As a law clerk for 1st Division Circuit Court, she drafted motions, briefs, jury instructions and overall assisted the Circuit Court Judge.

Currently, she is employed by the Public Defender's Office where she represents children charged with crimes in Perry and Pulaski Counties, including children charged with truancy, minor misdemeanors and murder felony cases.
